**MINUTES OF THE MATPRO 2023 AGM HELD ON 6th MAY 2023
AT 10.00 AM AT THE HASH ROOM,
ROYAL SELANGOR CLUB, JALAN RAJA, KUALA LUMPUR****1. PRESIDENT'S WELCOME ADDRESS**

- 1.1 The President called the meeting to order and greeted all present. He welcomed and thanked all members present to the 2023 Annual General Meeting, which was due in much earlier and had since been postponed till now due to the pandemic.
- 1.2 He informed that not much activity had taken place in the past few years due to the pandemic and the many challenges faced by the association namely;
 - a) The 2017 committee did not work as a team and he was saddled to carry the burden of the functions of MATPRO.
 - b) A lot of the committee members resigned and thus leaving the Association without enough internal support to carry out the duties.
 - c) During COVID, many TP's were burdened by the situation and thus the support for Matpro further declined.
 - d) Dr Kabur wants the President's term to be limited to only two terms. (hence 4 years)
 - e) MATPRO was almost deregistered but Dr Kabur intervened and complied with the basic requirements and managed to salvage the Association's registration in ROS
 - f) Bank has advised us to submit the Minutes of the last AGM in order to lift the freeze on our account.
 - g) We have almost RM 20,000 in MATPRO bank account
 - h) Some of activities MATPRO conducted post COVID are Coffee with Shahul and Coffee with Soffian to get insights into HRDCopr planning and future programs. MATPRO also was able to get HRDC to improve on the payment waiting period and the approval for new programmes. Now new programmes get approved within 3 days

President of MATPRO, Dr Abdul Kabur together with 8 new office bearers of MATPRO, paid a courtesy visit to the CEO of HRD Corp, Dato Shahul Dawood at Wisma HRD Corp. The engagement session was focused on MATPRO's role in playing a pivotal role as the voice for Training Providers .

MATPRO team shared the plans for the term, namely nation wide networking sessions among Training Providers and HRD Corp, Training Providers Convention and Dinner, International Education Tour and Standard code of ethics for Training Providers, among others.

HRD Corp CE then shared that one of his vision, is for Malaysia to have a high standard of Human Capital Development Framework and Infrastructure. He emphasized that he cannot achieve this without the professional support and trust of the Training Providers.

Some of his suggestions were to:

- 1) Increase our membership and be the force to be reckoned with.
- 2) Get to the roots and connect with the TPs from all over Malaysia - conduct engagement sessions.
- 3) Build a healthy and trustworthy relationship with HRDC and together we can strengthen the quality of TP's.
- 4) Form a special committee to uplift standards of TP by empowering and mentoring them.
- 5) MATPRO to have regional presence and HRDC will assist through their regional offices

Datuk Shahul also pledged that he is more than willing to make available resources in helping MATPRO achieve its objectives, as that would certainly increase the standards of the training industry in Malaysia.

NATIONAL TRAINING INDEX BRIEFING

MATPRO was invited to attend the National Training Index Briefing. The National Training Index or NTI is actually a measure of how active Malaysia is, in developing its Human Capital. It is derived from the real time data that are registered in the e-tris system in HRD Corp, and not just sampling.

The main objective of NTI is to establish an index that provides an indicator on the level of training “activeness” across various sub sectors in Malaysia, as defined by HRD Corp.

Mr Ronnie, the Chief Strategist Officer of HRD Corp who led this project, explained that this is a collaborative effort from various stake holders.

This is a new initiative and a result of 4 years research and development. He explained that with this, we now have an indicator of the strengths and gaps in the various industries as far as training is concerned.

Though the NTI may not represent accurately of the entire picture of training in Malaysia, as it does not capture non HRD registered training and training conducted by other government agencies, he said works are in progress to bring all under one window.

MATPRO’s take on this is, the NTI is a great start and just like any new developments, the NTI too will evolve over time and will certainly be subjected to several revisions along the way. Till then, something is definitely better than nothing.

TRAINING PROVIDERS BEST PRACTICES FORUM



On October 10, 2023, MATPRO successfully hosted the Training Providers Best Practices Forum at Wisma HRD Corp. Sponsored by HRD Corp, the event brought together key players in the training industry to network, engage in productive dialogue, and collaboratively work towards raising the standards of training provision across Malaysia.

The forum aimed to foster collaboration among Training Providers (TPs), exchange valuable insights, and generate innovative ideas for standardizing industry practices. The ultimate goal: to enhance the quality and impact of training services nationwide. The event was officially opened by Dr. Kabur, President of MATPRO, who delivered an inspiring welcome address. He emphasized the importance of unity, professionalism, and innovation within the training ecosystem. Dr. Kabur highlighted MATPRO's ongoing commitment to supporting Training Providers through advocacy, capacity-building initiatives, and representation. He called upon industry players to work together to shape a future-ready training landscape aligned with national development goals.

This was followed by a keynote address from the Guest of Honour, Datuk Wira Shahul Hameed, Chief Executive of HRD Corp. In his address, Datuk Wira underscored the importance of data-driven policies and urged TPs to leverage data analytics to make informed decisions. He announced that HRD Corp would be organizing Open Days every Thursday to facilitate greater collaboration and engagement between HRD Corp, employers, and TPs.

Datuk Wira also projected strong growth for the sector in 2023 and emphasized that TPs must maintain a focus on profitability while remaining agile and regionally responsive. He acknowledged and congratulated MATPRO for being the first and most active representative body for Training Providers in Malaysia, expressing his hopes that MATPRO would continue to play a strong, visible, and vocal role in advancing the industry.

10 OCTOBER 2023

TRAINING PROVIDERS BEST PRACTICES FORUM

The forum featured a series of insightful knowledge-sharing sessions designed to equip TPs with tools and strategies to grow and adapt their businesses:

- Mr. Kuljit Singh from MIHRM delivered the first presentation on The Training Landscape in the Next 5 Years. He shared valuable insights into future trends and how TPs can evolve to remain competitive in a rapidly changing environment.
- Mr. Arulkumar Singaraveloo of Malaysia HR Forum presented on Business Strategies for TPs, offering practical strategies from his personal journey. He demonstrated how building a strong virtual community significantly contributed to the growth of his business, inspiring many in attendance.
- En Mohd Faiz Bin Yunus from SME Corp presented on SME Corp's Role in Building Businesses. He explained the various support services offered by SME Corp and encouraged TPs to leverage these opportunities to enhance their growth and sustainability.

Another key segment was the dialogue session. The discussion was focused on two main areas - "Challenges faced by TPs" and "How to raise the TPs' standards". Here, the TPs engaged in a lively brainstorming segment, which allowed them to raise concerns, share challenges, and propose solutions. Key issues discussed included the TP rating system, criteria for TP registration, the development of a centralized trainer database, HRD Corp accreditation processes, and payment timelines. MATPRO will progressively address these matters in phases to ensure constructive resolutions.

The forum concluded with heartfelt closing remarks by Dr. Maria Rufina, Deputy President of MATPRO and Organising Chair of the event. She extended her appreciation to Datuk Wira, the speakers, and all participants for their active contributions and unwavering commitment to excellence in the training industry. Dr. Maria also encouraged TPs who are not yet members to join MATPRO, emphasizing the power of a unified voice in advocating for the sector.

The Training Providers Best Practices Forum marked a significant milestone in advancing the training industry's collective mission to deliver high-quality, impactful training services.

The Malaysian Training Provider Association, represented by Dr. Kabur (President), Lawrence Lai, Zainudin Kadir (Exco), and MATPRO members Jai Nanak Singh and Kalairasan, also participated in this discussion .

The following issues were discussed and will be further addressed by Perkeso:

- 1) To expedite the Training Application Process from 14 days to 7 days
- 2) Applications of additional trainers, as long as the certification body has approved the trainer. There should be no need for an additional review and approval process by Perkeso.
- 3) Allow all training to be completed within 3 months, without the necessity of imposing a 30-day period to commence training, as long as the training provider can complete it within 3 months.
- 4) Streamline the application process with a more user-friendly interface

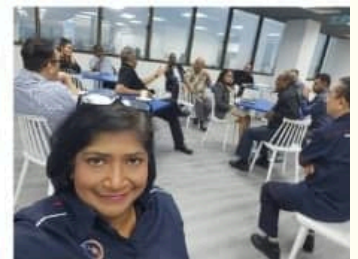
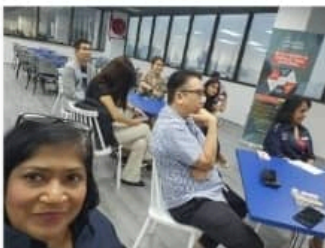

BRIEFING ON HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN NTW
